Masks

- Masks are optional in all MC Law buildings and classrooms, unless a faculty member requires mask wearing for their courses.
- If you choose to wear a mask (or it is required for your course), the CDC recommends that you wear a mask that has two or more layers of washable fabric; completely covers your nose and mouth; fits snugly against the sides of your face and does not have gaps; and has a nose wire to prevent air from leaking out of the top of the mask. Positive COVID-19 test

If you test positive for COVID-19, you are required to stay off campus for five (5) days from the time your symptoms started or, if you have no symptoms, from the date of your positive test. You may return to campus after five (5) days if you have no symptoms or if your symptoms are resolving. You should not return to campus if you have a fever.

- If you test positive, email your positive test results to Ms. Kim Phifer (kphifer@mc.edu), the Director of Student Services. The test result should include your name and the date of the positive test. If you test positive using an “at-home” test, make sure you include that information in your email.

Attendance and Access to Zoom/Class Recordings with Positive Covid-19 Test

- Students who are required to stay off campus due to a positive test will not be counted as absent from class and can attend class via Zoom. Otherwise, all absences count against a student’s class attendance record.
- Students who test positive must email their positive test result to their professors and make arrangements to attend class by Zoom.
- Access to Zoom is not guaranteed for all courses, such as simulation courses, clinics, externships, and adjunct-taught courses.

Remote Learning Accommodations Apart from Positive Test

- Students are expected to attend classes in person according to the published fall class schedule and through the stated teaching delivery method.
- Any student who believes he/she is entitled to a disability accommodation under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1983 to attend classes remotely should contact Ms. Kim Phifer, the Director of Student Services (kphifer@mc.edu or 601-925-7151).
- Accommodation approval does not include approval for online testing.
- Students who receive an accommodation may not be able to take their desired courses, such as simulation courses, clinics, externships, and/or adjunct-taught courses.

Availability of Zoom/Class Recordings Apart from Positive Test/Accommodation

As a general rule, Zoom/class recordings are not available for any reason other than a COVID-positive test or an accommodation obtained through the Director of Student Services.
