Stephanie Jackson Stephanie Jackson is a Louisiana native that has found her home in Mississippi. Stephanie is a life-long student-athlete, growing up playing football and basketball, the latter of which earned her a full scholarship to Tougaloo College where she studied English with a minor in Spanish. Upon graduating from Tougaloo, Stephanie joined the AmeriCorps National Civilian Community Corps where she served as a team leader in Denver, Colorado. Following her AmeriCorps service, Stephanie went on to serve her community as a law enforcement officer before enrolling into the Louisiana State University (LSU) Ourso School of Business. Stephanie ultimately decided that a career in law was more desirable and left the LSU Ourso School of Business, accepting a scholarship to the Mississippi College School of Law where she earned her Juris Doctor with a certificate in Business Law and graduated cum laude. Stephanie, however, never left sports. She is a former women's professional football player, retiring as a two-time champion, first-team All-American wide receiver, and a member of Team USA. Stephanie is also a former NFL scout and continues to work alongside the NFL as an NFL Flag Ambassador.
